

**Resolution
of the VI Meeting of the Eurasian Ombudsman Alliance
October 28, 2021**

We, the participants of the meeting of the Eurasian Ombudsman Alliance devoted to the contemporary issues of protecting the rights of young people in the Eurasian space,

- *Recognizing* that young people are an important part of society and the role they play in the member countries of the Eurasian Ombudsman Alliance;

- *Bearing in mind* United Nations General Assembly resolution 50/81 (1996) on the World Program of Action for Youth to 2000 and beyond;

- *Taking into account* UN Human Rights Council resolutions A/HRC/48/L.26/Rev.1 on the human rights implications of the COVID-19 pandemic for youth and A/HRC/RES/42/7 approving the Plan of Action for the fourth phase (2020-2024) of the World Program for Human Rights Education, where youth is included as a target group;

- *Building on* United Nations Security Council Resolution 2250 (2015) on Youth, Peace and Security;

- *Supporting* the participation of young women and men as a central element of inclusive and sustainable development, as well as demands for just, equitable and progressive opportunities and solutions in areas such as education, health, employment and equality;

- *Supporting* the initiatives of the World Conference on the Rights of Youth «Engaging Youth in Global Action», which took place in August 2021 in the city of Tashkent;

- *Recognizing* that young men and women of the member countries of the Eurasian Ombudsman Alliance seek full participation in the life of their societies;

- *Being convinced* that ombudsman institutions and national human rights institutions in general, members of the Eurasian Ombudsman Alliance, can make a greater contribution to the protection of the rights of young people;

- *Taking into consideration* the principles set out in Article 17 of the European Social Charter, namely the right of young people to adequate social, legal and economic protection;

Having considered at the meeting the reports of the heads of the member institutions of the Eurasian Ombudsman Alliance, decided:

1. To appeal the governments of our countries with a proposal to pay special attention to expanding socio-economic measures to support young people, including establishing or expanding programs of preferential mortgages, preferential loans for education, and grant programs for talented youth.

2. To work out the possibility and feasibility of creating an international bank of professional vacancies for the youth of the EOA member countries.

3. In order to improve the forms of protecting the rights of young people, to consider the issue of harmonizing the legislation governing the powers of the Ombudsmen of the EOA member countries in the field of protecting the rights of young people, including the creation of public youth councils under the Ombudsmen of the EOA.

4. To unite the efforts of the EOA ombudsmen to develop a model program "Human Rights" and a textbook for teaching in educational institutions, as well as lectures for young people.

5. To consider the possibility of including the summer session of young human rights defenders of the EOA in the program of one of the youth educational forums.

6. To work out the issue of improving the legislation of the member states of the EOA in the field of probation, in particular in regards to youth.

The event convened ombudsmen from eight countries who presented presenting a broad range of views on youth issues.
